Primary Biliary Cirrhosis Life Expectancy, Symptoms ...

Primary biliary cirrhosis (PBC) is a

progressive disease of the liver
caused by a buildup of bile within
the liver (cholestasis) that results in

damage to the small bile ducts that drain bile from the liver. Over time, this pressure build-up destroys the

bile ducts leading to liver cell damage. As the disease progresses and enough liver cells die, cirrhosis

and liver failure occur.

the patient's ok, they seem to have tolerated it”). Patients may look OK for a while, but later develop osmotic

to a hospital, survival is markedly reduced. If the patient needs ICU admission, then the risk of death is
